When I first saw paintings by people of the Warli tribe, an ancient east Indian tribe, it struck me that art does not need to be complex to be appreciated, it needs to reflect life. Unlike most other ancient Indian painting traditions that use vibrant colors and depict mythological stories in fine detail, Warli paintings express everyday life using extremely basic object forms and just one color - white - on an austere mud base. It abstracts three-dimensional space into 2 dimensions where objects seldom overlap. My art explorations started with this style and then expanded to diverse mediums including watercolor, oil, pastel, alcohol ink and encaustic. I have shown my paintings in several local juried exhibition including Employee Art Exhibition at Microsoft.
